What does a CNA do?

CNAs play an important role in patient care. CNAs can work at facilities like hospitals or nursing homes where they help people with basic everyday care such as moving, eating, dressing, and bathing.

They also support nurses by taking vital signs (like temperature and blood pressure) and watching for signs of an infection. They also help with daily operations like answering phone calls or speaking with patient visitors.

Many hospitals and nursing homes provide training for nurse aides once they have been hired to work at the facility. You can "earn and learn" by training while you work.
